ITINERARY

Monday – **October 7- DAY 1** – **DEPART** – We depart from Pittsburgh for our overnight flight to Lisbon. We enjoy in-flight movies, dinner, and breakfast aloft before arriving in Lisbon, Portugal the next day.

Tuesday – October 8 – DAY 2 – LISBON/SANTAREM/FATIMA – We are met and given a short orientation tour of Lisbon before the drive to Fatima. We stop along the way to celebrate Mass at the Church of the famous Eucharistic Miracle at Santarem. In the evening, we join the International Rosary Procession in Fatima. Dinner and overnight at our hotel.

Wednesday – **October 9** – **DAY 3** – **FATIMA** – This full day is devoted to visiting the Basilica and Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima and nearby hamlets of Aljustrel and Valinhos. We join the English language concelebrated Mass at the Chapel of Apparitions. We visit the birthplaces of Francisco, Jacinta and Lucia, the Loca de Anjo and the Holy Way. In the evening, we again join the International Rosary Procession. Dinner and overnight at our hotel.

Thursday – October 10 – DAY 4 – FATIMA/SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA – Today we depart Fatima, passing by the ancient capital and university city of Coimbra, where Lucia, the last Fatima visionary, lived as a cloistered nun. At a particularly beautiful location, we stop to walk with the pilgrims for a short time along The Coastal Portuguese Camino Route. (No more than 1-2 hours walking before the bus picks the group up.) We continue northwards into Spain and on to Santiago de Compostela, where St. James ("Santiago" in Spanish) is buried. This world-famous Shrine of Santiago is one of only three locations where the tomb of one of Jesus' Apostles can be visited: St. James in Spain, St. Peter's in Rome and St. Thomas in India. St. James preached here for seven years before returning to the Holy Land where he was beheaded in A.D. 44. He is credited with the conversion of Spain. On arrival this afternoon, we enjoy a visit to the Cathedral and the Old City here. To commemorate our parish's 100th Anniversary, we celebrate a special Mass at the Cathedral alongside the relics of our church's patron saint. While dinner is included at our hotel, the adventurous might consider enjoying the varied delights of the Galatian restaurants in the nearby Old City.

Friday – **October 11** – **DAY 5** – **SANTIAGO/SANTANDER** – Following breakfast, our morning is free for prayer, rest or enjoying this ancient city. Our tour manager can offer suggestions for local sites to see. We gather back at the cathedral in Santiago to participate in the Pilgrim's Mass at 12 noon followed by lunch on our own. Afterwards, we head east to Santander along the coastal "Pilgrim's Route of St. James." We enjoy the wonderful scenery as the roads hug the northern Spanish seacoast. Dinner and overnight in our Santander hotel.

Saturday – October 12 – DAY 6 – SANTANDER/GUERNICA/LOURDES – This morning we continue our drive. Lunch on our own is taken in Guernica where Pablo Picasso's most famous painting was inspired. In April 1937, under Spanish Dictator Francisco Franco's orders, German and Italian air forces bombed Guernica, turning it into a pile of rubble. Over 1,000 civilians died and 85% of the town's buildings were completely destroyed. Picasso's painting, completed months after the bombing, quickly gained monumental status and traveled extensively throughout Europe where it rose to fame as a statement against the barbarity of war. Even Hitler sought to acquire it and destroy it. After the end of the Spanish Civil War, "Guernica" was exhibited in the US, in an attempt to raise funds for Spanish war refugees. We proceed to our hotel in Lourdes for dinner and overnight. In the evening, we join the Torchlight Rosary Procession.

Sunday – **October 13** – **DAY 7** – **LOURDES** – This day is spent in devotion to Our Lady of Lourdes. We celebrate Mass at the Grotto, with a morning orientation visit to the Shrine and a walking tour of Lourdes, visiting Boly Mill, where St. Bernadette was born, the Cachot, formerly used as a jail, where she lived during the apparitions, and the parish church. This afternoon is free for private devotions, Eucharistic Procession, the Blessing of the Sick or the legendary, healing waters of the miraculous Lourdes spring. Dinner and overnight at our hotel. In the evening, we may once again join the Torchlight Marian Procession.

Monday – October 14 – Columbus Day – DAY 8 – LOURDES/ZARAGOZA – This morning we depart Lourdes and traverse the Pyrenees mountains entering northern Spain. We continue eastward to Zaragoza, a city founded by the Romans with luxuriant vegetation, cascades and grottos. Some call it the Switzerland of arid upper Aragon. This city was also the birthplace of Goya, whose works grace many of the sites we visit. This is #1 Marian shrine of Spain, the Pilar Basilica, and commemorates apparitions of Our Lady the Pillar to St. James in 40 A.D. We celebrate Mass here, if possible. Dinner and overnight at our hotel.

Tuesday – October 15 – St. Teresa of Avila – DAY 9 – ZARAGOZA/ MONTSERRAT – This morning we drive to Montserrat on the outskirts of Barcelona and celebrate Mass at the famous Benedictine Monastery that holds the famed Black Madonna. In March of 1522, the founder of the Jesuit order, St. Ignatius of Loyola, came as a pilgrim to Montserrat and placed his sword before the Black Madonna and exchanged his fancy clothes for those of a beggar. If possible, we enjoy the midday music of the famous boys' choir here. Dinner and overnight at our Monastery hotel here.

Wednesday – **October 16** – **DAY 10** – **MONTSERRAT/BARCELONA** – This morning we drive to Barcelona to celebrate Mass at the Cathedral. Following a tour of the Cathedral, we enjoy a morning on the streets of Barcelona's Gothic quarter including the famous open markets of the Ramblas. After lunch on our own, we see the important new developments at the pleasure port where many of the Olympic events were held in 1992. We enjoy a spectacular view from the top of the Montjuic hill before returning to Montserrat for dinner and overnight at our hotel.,

Thursday – October 17 – Day 11 – BARCELONA – Our final day of our pilgrimage begins with a trip to the spectacular unfinished Basilica of La Sagrada Familia, the crown jewel of Antonio Gaudi's architectural works. We join the 9 a.m. Mass in the crypt, celebrated in the local language of Barcelona, "Catalan". Afterwards, we enjoy a tour of the church that has been described as both a sandcastle and something out of a fairytale. Following lunch on our own, we visit the Unesco World Heritage "Park Guell" one of Gaudi's Masterpieces of "landscape architecture." We remain in Barcelona to cap our pilgrimage off with a festive farewell dinner in a local Catalan restaurant before returning to Montserrat for overnight at our hotel.

Friday – October 18 – DAY 12 – RETURN – We transfer to the Barcelona airport for our flight home to Clarksburg with unforgettable memories to cherish always.





TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Total Tour Price: The tour price is based on airfare, cruise, land rates and rates of exchange in effect August 16, 2024. All rates are subject to change without prior notice. Citizens of countries other than U.S. – please contact the consulate of the country or countries being visited to determine visa requirements.

Air Transportation: International flight reservations are being held on American Airlines. No stopovers are permitted. Any changes after tickets are issued carries a mandatory charge of \$200. Once the tickets are issued, they are NON-TRANSFERABLE AND NON-REFUNDABLE. Any requests to change a ticket once issued will incur a reissue fee of \$200 plus any fare differential will apply. Cancellation of air seat within 90 days of departure will incur a \$200 penalty.

Domestic Airfare: For those who make domestic air arrangements to the originating city of this tour, your tour host and Unitours strongly recommend the purchase of tickets that can be changed without heavy fees and penalties as international flight schedules are always subject to change.

Hotel Accommodations: Specially selected hotels based on twin occupancy with private bath. Single Room supplement of \$526 will be charged where requested and available.
